INVASIVE PLANT CONTROL IN LITCHFIELD IS POSSIBLE WHEN WE ALL DO OUR PART

#1) Learn your plants so you can look them up online and understand their life cycle and best ways to control. Positive identification is important. Learn to identify plants with a field guide such as "A Field Guide to Trees and Shrubs" by George A. Petrides. Call retired horticulturalist Lindsay Nelsen for an identification visit, 268-4569. Speak with Nancy Olmstead at Maine Natural Areas Program (MNAP). #2) Learn ways to control them. Can you mow weekly? A good control for Japanese knotweed/bamboo after cutting it down (dispose in garbage or burn as all parts can start a new plant). Can you dig up small plants? First cut loosestrife flowers and seeds into a bag in June-September when you can see them. Small shrubs pull easily from moist soil. Cut down and cover: With heavy linoleum for knotweed, with heavy contractor bags tied at base for woody shrubs to deprive the plants of light. Cut the stems of woody shrubs and dab with small amount of 50% solution of glyphosate using a sponge applicator or a paint brush. Call a licensed professional applicator. MNAP recommends controlling the outer perimeter of the infestation site and working your way in to get the outliers that will spread the site further. #3) Form a neighborhood team since your invasive plant will soon be on your neighbor's property or theirs will come to yours. Set a 2-hour time slot to get together and do the simple work of control. None of the work is hard but getting started and persevering are important. And a group is always more fun. #4)Volunteer for control on public use lands and learn a lot with the Friends of the Litchfield Landscape /Conservation Commission.
