Litchfield Transfer Station

Please be advised that the Litchfield Transfer Station Single Source recycling operation will begin the week of JANUARY 12TH & 13TH 2018 (WEATHER PERMITTING).

This operation consists of citizens bringing their plastic, glass, tin, and paper to the Transfer Station in clear plastic bags. These bags will be placed in a forty-yard octagon shaped roll off container that is attached to a compactor. This will allow us to quadruple the amount of these recyclables in one container. Recycling citizens will be provided one roll of clear plastic bags (10 bags). Clear plastic bags can be purchased at Gowell's Shop & Save, located on Rte 197 in Litchfield.

Only clear plastic bags will be allowed for the Litchfield Single Source Recycling.

Cardboard will be placed in another forty-yard octagon shaped roll off container. The cardboard container will be open at one end and the citizens will take cardboard into the container and they will stack the flattened cardboard at the rear of the container. As the cardboard stack fills to the top of the container, the next stack will be started in front of the last stack, repeating this process till the container is full. We are in hopes that the simplification and quickness of this recycling process encourages more Litchfield citizens to participate in recycling.

Town Manager/Clerk's Corner:

Snowmobiles can be registered at the Town Office, but also can be purchased **on line with a credit card through the link under "Online Registrations**" on the town website on the right-hand side-bar (www.litchfieldmaine.org). Also, dogs must be licensed by January 31st to avoid a late fee of \$25. **Office closures:** The Town Office will be closed on Monday, Jan 1st for New Year's Day, and Monday, Jan 15th for the Martin Luther King, Jr holiday.

Winter is upon us and our plows have been operating. Our drivers routinely push the snow back at the edge of the road to accommodate snow from future storms, so having your mailbox installed properly is important. For reference, here are the general United States Postal Service Requirements for Curbside Residential Mailboxes.

- Mailboxes must be placed 6 to 8 inches away from the curb or shoulder edge; the slot or door must be 41 to 45 inches from the ground (45" being preferable in rural locations).
- All manufactured mailboxes must meet the internal and external dimension requirements of the USPS.
- **Curbside mailboxes** must be placed on the right-hand side of the road and facing outward so that mail carriers can access it easily without leaving their vehicle.
- The box or house number on a mailbox must be represented in numbers that are at least 1 inch tall, and they must be positioned on the front or flag side of the box.
- **Curbside mailbox** posts should be buried less than 24 inches deep and made from wood no larger than 4 inches high by 4 inches wide. Steel or aluminum pipes with a 2-inch diameter are also acceptable.
- Newspaper receptacles may be mounted on the same post as the mailbox, but they must not contact the mailbox directly or be supported by it.

SOME THINGS TO CONSIDER FOR THE NEW YEAR 2018

What do we want our Town to look like in the future? I'm guessing we want forests to walk, hunt in and harvest; lakes and streams to play on and fish, farmland for food and work. That's why we want to control invasive plants now. Starting with your own property EARLY DETECTION and RAPID RESPONSE to invasive species prevent the smaller amounts of today from overwhelming our forests, waters and farms over time. Join in this year to help out and have some fun and exercise. TOWN PROGRAMS. In 2017 we began to control Japanese Knotweed / Japanese bamboo with an effective spray program for the roadsides, for a large infestation around the Public Works buildings and on the same day some town residents paid privately for control on their property. We want to continue this program further. Contact the Conservation Commission or the Road Committee lmnelsen@fairpoint.net now to sign up for this year's spray program for your property. Knotweed will just get bigger and bigger. And Knotweed is a huge problem once it gets into water ways. Purple loosestrife control is now on the radar thanks to Ann Goselin and George Rogers and others. We are looking to map all the areas of Purple Loosestrife in Town and work with homeowners to control. Please contact the Conservation Commission lmnelsen@fraipoint.net to report on those pretty and dangerous purple plants flowering from June to September on your land in wet areas. Join a group now who are cutting them into garbage bags first (to prevent the tiny seeds from spreading) and digging up smaller plants. Manual control of invasive woody shrubs in Town forests and in the Community Park was begun in 2017. Join volunteers in spring who dig out small plants, cut down and cover large ones. Contact the Conservation Commission Imnelsen@fairpoint.net In April 2017 a small planting of the low growing and spreading native woody shrub Sweetfern was planted on the steep bank next to the new Ferrin Road bridge to prevent erosion and to out compete honeysuckle which are found nearby. Look for invasive plant information on the Town website down the road a bit to see what invasives you have, find links to the Maine Natural Areas Program and learn about control. Envision your ideal Town, our public and private lands, roads and open spaces. And join in controlling the invasives today.
